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Course Objective:

It is aimed to provide students a thorough understanding of supply chain management and why it is important to learn supply chain management and logistics. This course is concerned with managing the flow of goods and information through a production or distribution network, encompassing all stages from the supplier to the customer. Supply chain management course intends to acquaint students with supply chain and logistics and what students need to know to manage supply chains.

Learning Outcomes:

- Demonstrate an understanding of the conceptual framework of supply chain management, supply chain business processes and the different organizations that participate in supply chains in order to identify the components of supply chain and their interactions.
- 2 Demonstrate an understanding of the role of information systems and technology in supply chain management and logistics to comprehend the usage of new information technologies and electronic commerce in supply chain management
- 3 Recognize the role of logistics management within supply chain management in order to identify the strategic importance of logistics to achieving business success by creating value throughout supply chains.
- 4 Interpret supply chain management cases and articles in order to integrate theories and concepts to real business applications.
- 5 Improve oral and written communication skills through class discussions and presentations.

Further Notes about Assessment Methods:

Assessment Criteria:

 The learner will clearly demonstrate knowledge and understanding of facts, terms, and concepts related to supply chain management in midterm exam
 In case studies, all group members must be involved in the analysis of the case. All groups will shortly discuss the case content and present their solutions. The presentation should specify: (a) the core issue(s) being investigated, (b) analysis and (c) recommendations. Besides, groups are expected start a class discussion. The assessment will be done according to the fulfillment level of these criteria.
 For group projects, the students in groups of 3 or 4 will select a firm which embraces a global supply chain structure. The supply chain structures of the selected firms will be analyzed according to the topics covered during the lectures. Groups are expected to identify the problems faced by the firms and should suggest solutions to the problems. Students will also make a 20-minute presentation of their group projects in class. All reports should be typed with a maximum of 15 pages (1.5 line-spacing, 11 or 12 pt. font size).
